#### **EO MISSIONS**

ESA contributes data from the EU's Copernicus **Sentinel-1** (radar) and **Sentinel-2** (optical) missions, allowing the Charter to use resources and expertise to coordinate for rapid response to major disasters

# **6X** PRIMUS INTER PARES

Every six months, a different member takes the role of 'Primus Inter Pares' — or Charter lead — which involves coordinating the overall activities of the Charter for the designated period.

ESA has covered this role six times to date

#### **SPECIFIC CONTRIBUTION**

ESA's main input has been creating the Charter Web portal and the Charter Operational 2nd generation System (COS-2), which is used during all Charter activations. This allows the different entities of the Charter to perform their work, enabling the Charter Executive Secretariat to follow the workflow of the activation, quickly intervening in case of issues
